At 4:35 PM Tuesday June 27, 1978, the new tower structure reached the final height of 1,894 feet above ground. The 106 foot television antenna extends the overall structure to 2,000 feet which will then be the tallest man-made structure, of any type, east of the Mississippi river. Mr. AJ, Jim Goodmon, and Aubrey Moore, were on hand for the final section lift. In the tradition of iron workers, the crew attached an 8 foot tall pine tree to project above the top steel to signify 'topping out'. Unfortunately such an object is extremely difficult to detect 1,894 feet up in the air.
