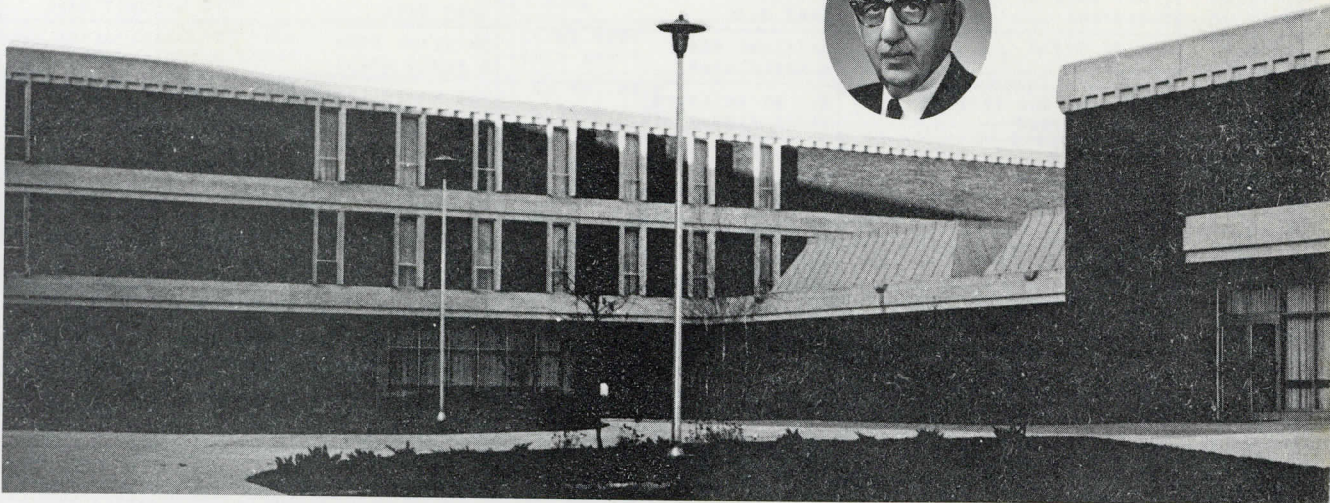
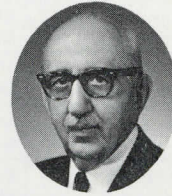

Following the March meeting of the Board of Trustees of East Carolina University, President Leo Jenkins announced the naming of the new music building complex at ECU as "The A. J. Fletcher Music Center". Mr. Fletcher, Chief Executive Officer of Capitol Broadcasting Company, was cited for his continuing interest in the arts, with particular emphasis on his making it possible for the school children of North Carolina to see this art form, through his touring National Opera Company. W. W. Taylor, a trustee of the University, described Fletcher as "a man who brought music to this state before music was a household word"
