



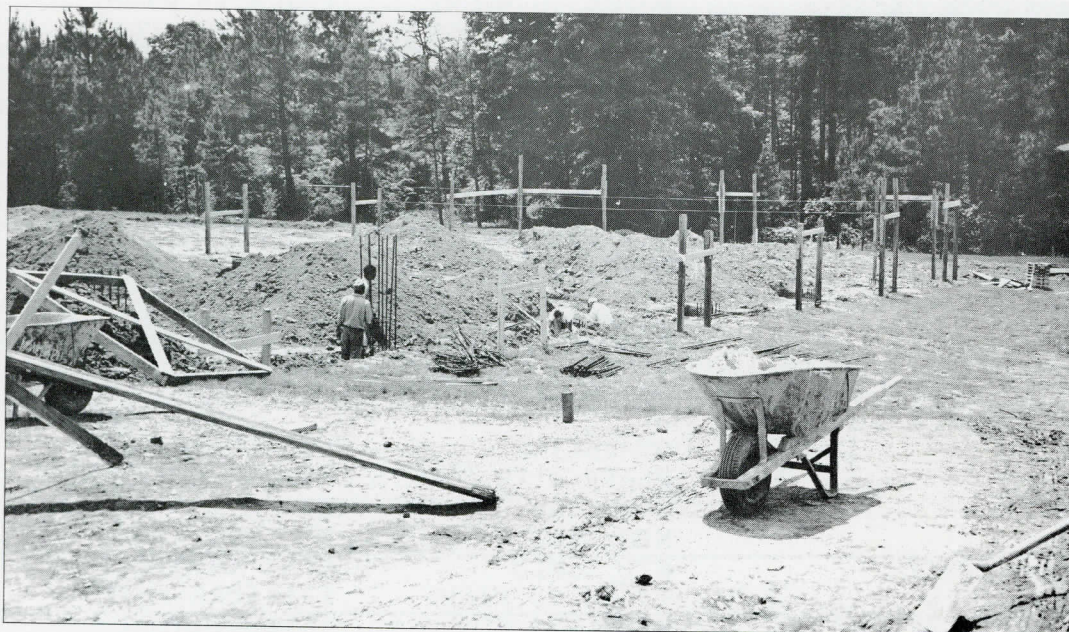

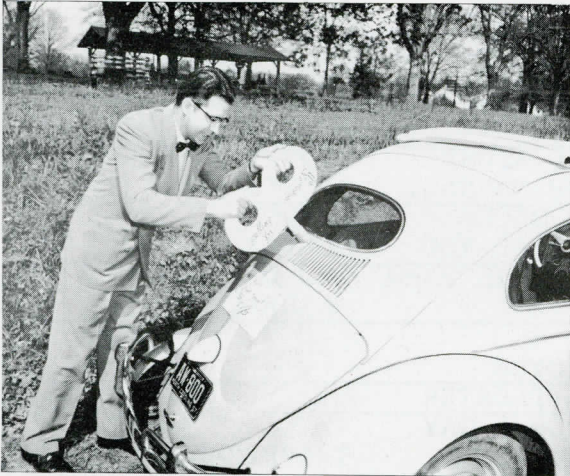
#### ENJOY LAWRENCE WELK ON SUNDAY
