



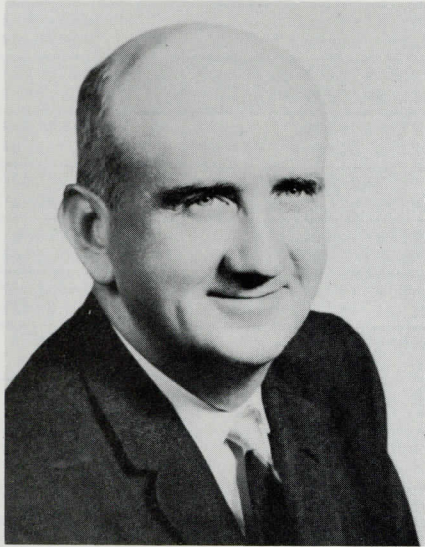

FRED FLETCHER RETIRES

Fred Fletcher, President of Capitol Broadcasting Company, Inc. announced his retirement last month after a thirty-six year career in broadcasting. Beginning with WRAL radio, he became manager, and was elected President of the Corporation that operates WRAL-TV and other related interests, in 1966. In the 1940's and the early 1950's he was well known as the host of TEMPUS FUGIT, an early morning talk and record show. His television special, THE GOLDEN AGERS CHRISTMAS PARTY was a community institution. A former member of the Raleigh City Council, Fletcher has served as the long time Chairman of the Advisory Board for the Raleigh Parks and Recreation Commission. He was recently appointed to the newly formed WAKE

COUNTY RECREATION COMMITTEE. His future plans include travel, "but I won't get too far from Raleigh," he said, "I have thirteen tomato plants to nurse along."
